

Practical learning

During the intake interview with your program director, you determined which workplace is most suitable for you. But it doesn't stop there.

You will start learning a trade in practice. This will be done in a way that is appropriate for secondary vocational education (MBO). You don't have to go to school for this: you will learn the trade while you work.

The profession you are going to learn involves tasks that you will practice on the job. If you can perform these tasks, or a number of them, well, you can obtain an MBO practical certificate. An MBO practical certificate is officially recognized by the MBO and is also valuable outside of

IBN: other employers will know exactly what you are capable of.

Once you know which profession you are going to learn, you will receive new sheets for your talent folder. These are the sheets listing your professional skills. These will be tested a number of times and discussed with you. This way, you will know exactly how far you have come and for which skills you can obtain a practical certificate. While learning a profession, you will receive all the guidance you need from IBN. So you are definitely not on your own!
